## Puppetry is Focus of the Fifth Year of the Fifth Grade Arts Festival



On October 20, 21, and 22, 2015 the Community Building was buzzing with fifth graders from Caledonia, Lincoln, Meehan, Perry, Seth Whitman Elementary, Washington Academy, Immanuel Lutheran and St. James Catholic school students.

Musician Mark Dvorak kicked off each day with the History of American Music by singing folk songs, playing different instruments and inviting the audience to participate.

Several artists provided small group classes focusing on the theme of Puppetry. Gary Tate taught the technique of using puppets by demonstrating several different kinds of puppets performing on a stage. Then students used hand puppets to practice.



Connie Kuntz and Meghan Baylor had the students produce “playettes” with dialogue that they could use to perform with puppets. Norm Knott fostered his “Recycle Reuse” lesson by having the students make puppets out of brown paper lunch bags.

Our hope was that when the students left the Festival they would use the puppets they made and the skills they developed to perform for other classes or groups. The Perry School students took that idea and produced their weekly Video Newscast with puppets.

The BHS Band entertained during lunch and director, Dan Foster, let the students try out the trash can drums.



Kit Scheidenhelm and Dee Santorini returned for a third year to show wheel thrown pottery, a form of art that students wouldn't be exposed to in school. Mrs. Santorini had them help her make a pot in each class which they then initialed. She took them and fired them and presented them to the classes before Christmas. What a wonderful memento of the day.

The Arts Council is already planning the 2016 Festival and have reserved the Community Building for Oct. 18, 19, and 20. There's something for the fourth graders to look forward to.


