Highlighting some of Boone County's most significant events, this mural includes the Belvidere tornado, the crowning of Miss America Judi Ford, the Boone County Fair, and the Chrysler Motors Assembly Plant. It also recognizes the richness of the farming community.

The Lady Diamond bicycle was produced by the National Sewing Machine Company, a manufacturing giant in Belvidere for over 75 years.
